



## **A Letter to Temporary Alcohol Sales License Holders**

Dear License Holder,

The Enforcement Team of the Rice County Chemical Health Coalition is committed to keeping alcohol out of the hands of Rice County youth. As a part of that effort, the Enforcement Team has been working in partnership with South Central College, City and County governments to train those who are licensed to sell alcohol and those who sell and serve alcohol. We have local trainers who provide the education that helps qualify businesses for licensing and for reductions in their dram shop insurance. More importantly, this combined effort is helping to keep kids away from alcohol.

**As a holder of a temporary alcohol license, we know that you use volunteers in selling alcohol at special events. We also know that many of those volunteers may not have the training that helps them follow the laws designed to keep alcohol away from youth and to keep adult drinkers safe. In order to help ensure that your temporary license activity complies with the law and with good safety practices, we would like to offer you a special training opportunity for your volunteers.**

Enclosed you will find an information sheet describing the training we offer. Contact information is contained in the information sheet if you wish to arrange a training session. We expect to host one or more trainings in the spring and summer of 2009. We welcome your comments and questions and we hope you will consider participating in this important effort to keep our community safe.

# Temporary License Holder Training

## **Purpose of the Training:**

To train volunteers with non-profit groups who are serving/selling alcohol under a temporary license for a special event. **This training is not open to individuals or organizations holding a regular license even if they also have a temporary license for a particular event.**

## **Training Content:**

- ◆ Importance of Training
- ◆ Penalties for Providing Alcohol to Minors
- ◆ Identification Issues
- ◆ Tools to Help You Serve Alcohol Safely

## **Training Details:**

In partnership with South Central College, the Rice County Chemical Health Coalition will offer group training to those individuals who will sell or serve alcohol as volunteers with non-profit groups. The non-profit group will pay \$10.00 per person for training. Each individual trained will receive a certificate verifying completion of the course. Trainings will be held for a minimum of 15 participants. *Enrollment in the training can come from one or more volunteer groups to meet the minimum total number of participants.* If a group would like to have their own training, the cost would be \$150 for up to 15 participants.
